Match Format:

Best 2 out of 3 sets to 6 using no ad scoring. Receiver chooses side for deuce points.
If set tied 6 games all, then 7 point tiebreak is played to decide set.
In the event a 3rd set is needed, a 10 point match tiebreak is played.

Tiebreaks:

- Set (or 7 point) or Match (or 10 point) tiebreaks follow the same rules.
- The first server is determined by continuing the service rotation. If you served in last game, then you don't start serving in the tiebreak.
- Start the serve for the first point on the deuce side (right).
- After the first point, the opposite team or player serves twice. The first on the ad or left side following by a second serve on the right side.
- After 6 points are played, the players or teams switch ends of the court. Switching continues every 6 points.
- The winner is the first to reach 7 by two for set tiebreaks, and 10 by two for match tiebreaks.
- The tiebreak score is recorded in TennisLink as 1-0.
